



"Yours is the new generation of Canadians" said W. T. Newnham, president of Seneca College and guest speaker for the evening.

Present for the occasion were the first students to complete their entire senior and junior matriculation at K.C.S.S.

The Sixth Graduation of K.C.S.S. held on November 24th saw 34 Honour Graduates and 125 Grade 12 Graduates. Certificates of Training and Student Parliament Proficiency Awards were also presented.

The students' parents and guests listened as Mr. Newnham spoke of personal satisfaction derived from their education. Rev. G. K. Agar gave the invocation with Mr. J. M. Hunter bringing greetings from the District School Board. The band led by Mr. Mulcahey showed what practice can do.

Years here at King are memorable for not just the award winners but for everyone concerned. But I can't sum it up as well as this excerpt from the valedictory by Allan Huycke:

"I have the strong impression of high school days as being ones of expanding personal experience. They were times for meeting people and seeing friendships formed, some will last and others will simply cease to exist. This realization, however, does not make those original contacts any less important.

In my mind I can still picture certain teachers drilling into us German verbs and latin verses and rules about how we really ought to use that there good Queen's English proper like.

I can still see in particular one teacher who gave us more than text book learning. Every week he would write a different proverb in German and in French on his board. While that proverb stared us in the face he would fill our ears with more wisdom and philosophy about life. I won't repeat one or any of the profound things he said. They belong to me and anyone else who heard them.

But such wisdom about the ways of life we learned here, if not from that man, then from others. If I may quote from Dylan Thomas, we came to King "green and care-free" and left it "green and golden". We are still youthful but our feeling for life is riper now.

And so, we the graduates leave King. It was our life for five years. It is no more. But for me, and I am sure for many others, impressions of years spent at King City Secondary School will not soon fade."




