

VALEDICTORY ADDRESS

Commencement 1972-Dale Stanway

Good Evening Ladies and Centlemen:

As I stand here facing you, there are at least a few hundred faces facing me. And those faces are representative of three distinctive generations, Firstly, there are members of my generation - tonight's graduating class. Secondly, there's the generation that taught us - parents and teachers. And there are a few members of the generation which preceded these two, for I detect at least a few proud grandparents in the audience.

And it is to the members of the latter two mentioned generations that I'd like to offer a sincere thanks to,

I have a reason for so doing.

You see, I'm presently a student who is associated with a faculty of Environmental Studies; and one of the "in" things among some students of the environment seems to be to knock the "establishment". According to them the world is pretty fouled up and it is their parents and grandparents with their materialistic goals who caused the foul situation. Well a few weeks ago I left a depressingly pessimistic discussion and trotted off to the library to investigate just what terrible people my parents, teachers and grandparents really were.

It wasn't long before I discovered that those who had materialistically doubled the percapita output, in just the five past decades, had in the same time period increased the average life expectancy by $\frac{5}{2}$ of what it was and had reduced the long working day by 4 hours. It was these people who have given me a healthier world than they found. A world in which I have little fear of typhus, diptheria, small pox, scarlet fever, measles or mumps, polic or TB. And I decided my environmental pessimists should make note of the fact that it was because some people were both materialistic and self-sacrificing that they were in university and that they will work fewer hours, learn more, have more bours of leisure, travel more, and have more chances to fulfill their life's ambitions than did their parents.

So - to the parents, teachers and others who gave us, tonight's graduating class, the chance to be where we are this evening, THANK YOU,

Now, I haven't said we're thrilled with the world; it is overpopulated, it's polluted, there are still wars, and there are all sorts of social ills. But you, the "establishment", have given us a hell of a lot of the tools with which to solve some of these problems, and a fairly good world in which to do just that, solve the problems, And with your continued faith and encouragement some of us will be doctors, lawyers, scientists, and social scientists, and still others of us will just BE. We'll be nothing great, but we will be individuals and we'll each have our place.

King City Secondary meant many different things to many of us. For some of us it was the place where we had our first romance, the time we fell madly in and out of love. It was a place where we studied everything from laudable or laborous Latin to challenging or confusing computer science. It was at King that the thirsty thirteens thanked the government for reducing the drinking age and where we learned how to quench our thirsts both during studies and after school. We learned for which classes it was necessary to do homework and for which it wasn't.

And it was just last term that we learned how terribly precious our friendships are, Because some of us suddenly lost two very close friends, Don Ellison and Wayne Cook, They'll be remembered, not for their sudden absence but because of their once very vital and conspicuous presence.

Each year we returned to King, some how anxious to do so. The boys gathering to comment on what the summer had done to "develop" some of the girls and the girls gathering to see what new males had been imported to K. C. S. S.

Each year we complained of our new teachers yet each successive year we felt last year's teachers weren't so bad after all.

We complained of the routine and the Impersonality of King and now we've left we have discovered that we still have the same complaint but of a different place.

We learned everything from the passive periphrastic to oxy-redox reactions and some of us became most proficient scholars.

Most of us, however, may never receive any awards for being proficient students. But I think we'll all be rewarded for having been together at King. For, as one of my friends once put it, tonight's graduating class is like a big family. And it's because of the interaction between the serious and the light bearted, between the language and the math students, between the bright and the not so bright of us, that we are a family, a family of learning. As in all families there has been an interchange of ideas and a clashing and mixing of personalities. Perhaps the most important things learned here weren't mathematics or English after all; but rather, what people are, how they relate and how they react.

Children grow, and we the children of this great big family will slowly grow apart, but I doubt that we'll ever quite forget the years we spent together,

Let us hope that amid the noise and haste, in a sometimes frustratingly functional and factual world, that we'll continue to learn not just of books but of PEOPLE,












