VALEDICTORY ADDRESS - Andy Curran

It is a funny feeling that we experience as we sit here tonight. This will be the last time, at least for Grade 13 graduates, that we sit in this gymnasium in any kind of official capacity. When next we find ourselves here, we will be strangers, people from the outside looking in. It has always been strange that, in other years, we would hear someone give a valedictory address saying how much King had done for them and how it was sad to leave such a fine school; we would wonder how they could speak like that when just a few months before they didn't take the school seriously at all and were always criticizing it. Yet now we are in the same position, and we look around and find that in these surroundings where we used to feel so "at home", we feel somehow out-of-place now. I look out at all the familiar faces, friends that I have seen in class and after school every day for five years, and I realize this is the last time that all of us will be together. We would have never admitted it before, but this place has meant a lot to us. ....

..... Tonight, we are filling our last official position in the gymnasium, that held by the graduates.

Other people in my position, in other schools perhaps, have thought it wise to use their address to criticize their school; to fling harsh words against today's educational system. I don't think this is the time and the place for that. We aren't here tonight to look bitterly back on our high school days as if they were wasted years in an unrewarding educational system. ....

..... We probably could have done more work in our spares last year, we didn't have to play tag in the library or otherwise bother Mr. Edward, inevitably getting kicked out when his blood reached the boiling point. Mr. Eckersley didn't particularly enjoy all the little games we played on him with the blue sheets and yellow sheets and everything else, and perhaps we would have received more benefit from Mr. Macdonald's Algebra class if we had paid as much attention to him as we did to the phys. ed. baseball games outside the window. But the fact remains that many of us did do these things.....

..... I think the most important education we received in high school was through our relationships with other people. This school threw us all together at a rather young age and, as a group, we lived several of the most important years of our lives. The emotional and physical changes during the high school years are probably greater than any other period, and during this time we grew together, finding things out about ourselves from each other. One might say that we have been children here. And, to varying extents, we have all grown. ....

..... If people could be more idealistic, perhaps in this childish naive way, they would never accept that these sad truths have to be that way. We should believe that we can make this world better, even if rampant inflation, starvation, war, and everything else seem to make it hopeless. It will take this childish naivete, this "wonder", to make us always appreciate what we've got and to enable us to hold our ideals high, to believe that we do have a chance to make this world a better place to live in. I would like to conclude tonight with a wish that all of us in this graduating class can retain some of the beneficial qualities of childhood that I have spoken of, combining them with a mature outlook on life, and in this way be happy in the years ahead of us.
