
OUR NEW VICE-PRINCIPAL































INITIATION DAY: From the View Point of an Honourable "NINER"

For the first time in the year, the whole class of niners waits for the teacher to dismiss them, and, even at that, they hesitate.




All this aside, the end of the day has brought students closer together and all now have a mutual understanding that you can't be tough until you're in GRADE THIRTEEN!
