






Chug-a-lug





































Junior awards

Bursaries and Scholarships were also awarded to the top students. After the valedictory address, given by Ingrid Mag, the graduates filed out of the gym and into the waiting future.










Not just a canoe trip

The King City Music Department has continued to be extremely busy once again this year. The 250 members of the Music Department were eligible to participate in several groups including Junior, Intermediate and Senior Concert Bands, Vocal Ensemble, Girls' Triple Trio, Mens' Chorus and Junior or Senior Stage Band.

The Junior Concert Band consist mainly of Grade 9 students and rehearsed weekly on Tuesdays after school and was directed by Mr. Corbett. This year the Intermediate Concert Band consisted mainly of Grade 10 students and was directed by Mrs. Hoffer.

The Intermediate Concert Band performed this year for Junior Awards Night in October, and at the Woodbine Centre Mall during the Christmas season. The Vocal Ensemble is a relatively new performing group at King City. The group, only three years old, was directed by Mrs. Gilbert and Mrs. Hoffer. The members participated in many performances this year, including local schools, old age homes and the Annual Music Night held in May. Two groups which are derived from the Vocal Ensemble are the Girls' Triple Trip and the Mens' Chorus. For their outstan-

ding performance in the York Region Music Festival in May 1987, the Girls' Triple Trio won a trophy which has been displayed in the K.C.S.S. showcase at

the school this past year.

The senior Concert Band, directed by Mr. Corbett and Mrs. Gilbert, consisted of approximately 85 students, enrolled mainly in Grades 11-13. Senior Band which rehearsed weekly at 7pm on Tuesday nights, has performed at Senior Commencement in November, presented the 7th Annual All Saints Christmas evening at All Saints Church in King City, performed at the Newmarket Lions Festival and was the final segment of the Music Night program in May. In addition to performances, band members also participated in Banda-thon in January. This year, members of the Senior Concert Band participated in two adventures. During the first week of May, approximately 40 band members travelled to Rochester, New York to visit the Eastman School of Music, one of the most outstanding music schools in North America.

While there, they attended a performance by the Eastman Wind Ensemble, also one of the top performing college ensembles of the Eastman School. After staying overnight, the group visited the Eastman Kodak plant for a tour and returned to school the next day. During the exciting trip to perform in Vancouver at Expo 86 two years ago, several students joked about taking the band to perform at the next World's Fair to be held in Brisbane, Australia during 1988. Although no one took this idea seriously at the time, during February 1987 an enquiry was made to Expo 88 regarding a performance by the K.C.S.S. band in Brisbane.

The Senior Stage Band is the most advanced performing group in the Music Program. Directed by Mr. Corbett and rehearsing weekly at the unusual time of 7:30 Thursday mornings, this band undertakes difficult and challenging music for pleasure and performance. The Senior Stage Band also performed at the Ontario Pavillion of Expo 86 in Vancouver, and has performed at John Taylor Collegiate in Winnipeg in 1987.

Other performances have included the Annual Christmas program at All Saints Church, Grade 8 Parents' Night, local school concerts, the University of Toronto Faculty of Engineering, the Newmarket Lions Festival, Open House and Music Night.

In addition to normal involvement, several individual students also take on additional responsibilities in the operation of the department.






... The proposed library expansion

Bodies, pencils, books and paper are strewn across the floor. There isn't a free seat available anywhere. The slamming of books, the rustling of paper and idle conversation are deafening, making it impossible to concentrate. But the new addition, hopefully being built this summer, will alter this unfortunate situation. The new addition will encompass the area west of the existing library, between it and the school. It will be 5044 square feet and will accomodate 102 students. A portion of the library will be allocated for individual study carrols, which will especially benefit the senior students. The reference table will remain and the office will be converted into a seminar room. A new office will be made in the south-west corner of the addition. A class study area will be created in the northeast corner, so that classes and individuals can utilize the library facilities simultaneously.

To help us use the new resource centre more effectively, a computerized card catalog will be installed. To insure continued access to a large and varied source of information, a security system, which detects whether or not books have been signed out at the circulation desk, will be included. The system works on a principal similar to the inventory control tags that you see in clothing stores. The books will be tagged with a substance detectable by sensors at the entrance/exit. All of these investments will culminate in a library suited for both individual and group study needs, and will undoubtedly be of great benefit to everyone at King City Secondary School.


Exchange students


Egypt '88 By Mr. Wright
