









It's been one of those days.









the fun -filled bours of sparesiom! (picture 7) The bours of waiting for something exciting to happen, or at least until your next class.





## The Spirit


There is a spirit at this school. It lingers in the hallways, in the gymnasium and on the fields, even when students have long been gone. The sound of voices cheering and yelling echos still.



Junior Awards is a time to honour the academic achievements of the students of KSS. Amongst this years top award winners were Robert Church and Adesh Vora with the highest averages in grade 9; Lisa Giardino, and Greg Lanz for those in grade 10; Odilia Bonebakker and Shane Von Svoboda for grade 11. 




combination or, even worse, carrying BOOKS!!!!

that just isn't so.








### **BOYS SOCCER**

POLICY STATEMENT ON GULF WAR: Violent agression is not a solution to

On a planet with the military potential to destroy itself, diplomacy is the only method of resolution which can produce lasting and effective results. This includes the use of occasions statistics. Previous to January 15th only a solven among two made to deploy these methods. Furthermore, when a conflict escalates to a global case no one nation has the right to refuse compromise and dictate terms of negotiation. It is the responsibility of the United Nations without single-handed interference by the USA, to begin and carry our necessary diplomatic measures... Neither the UN nor any other group however, has the right to call for a physical assault on a country or region.

In a situation such as the one unfolding now in the Middle East it is essential that there be humanitarian aid to help with casualities of all sorts. Food, water and medicine are required in war zones to prevent disease and senseless human suffering. And is also needed to repair and prevent damage to the fragile ecceystem of which we and all living things are a

Canada, in this generation, has traditionally played a role as a neutral peacekeeping nation. Our recent actions in the Middle East completely reverse these policies. The use of
violent aggression runs contrary to the very foundations of Canada's existence. Our
resources, in dollars and manpower would be better served providing environmental and
hamantarian aid in the Middle East, rather than forming a symbolic aggressive force,
Canada's strength is an cooperative multiculturalism... By condoning the assault of a foreign
culture and the forced imposition of ethnocentric western views upon the world we are
destroying the ties that hold our country together. Canada is built upon the concept of
mutual consistence between people with different perspectives. We therefore must play a
role as a positive neutral country, not choosing a side but assisting all involved and
hopefully enabling then to come to a peaceful compromise.
