










Casa Loma

In October, grade ten history students were awed by Toronto's Casa Loma and Spadina House. As any grade ten can now tell you, Casa Loma means 'house on the hill', and it was built in 1911 by Sir Henry Mill Pellat. Sir Henry and his wife decorated their urban palace with extravagance. The bathroom has six taps to take better advantage of the water! There are many gardens outside, and also in the conservatory.

Spadina House was owned by James Austin; the president of Consumer Gas Company in 1874. The house is now maintained by the Ontario Heritage Foundation. It is a much more humble structure than Casa Loma, but is still beautiful. It is a good example of how the rich lived in the past.


Sr. Hockey

Wrestling




