
PEP RALLY








CAFETERIA LUNCHES







Each costume was very creative and interesting in its own characteristics, but we felt that Leah and Bill topped the cake.



























STUDY HALL


As you walk into the bleak, unstimulating space enclosed by four walls, decorated in an offwhite, flat, dry paint,

AS THE BELL TOLLS












Rememberance Day Assembly




Junior Football
