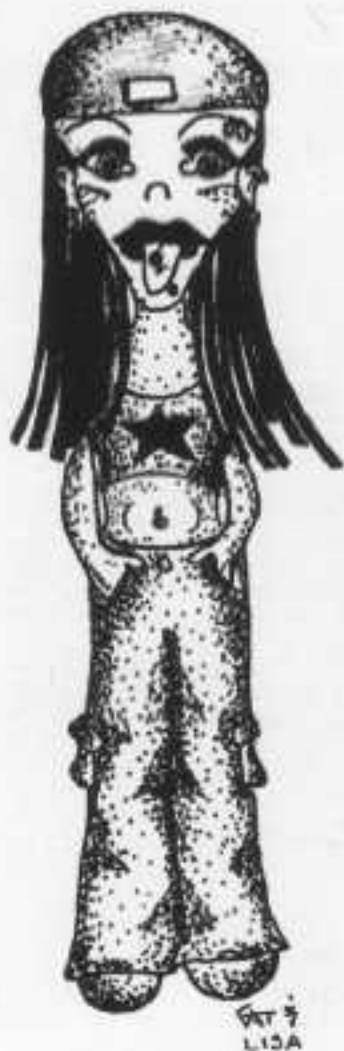

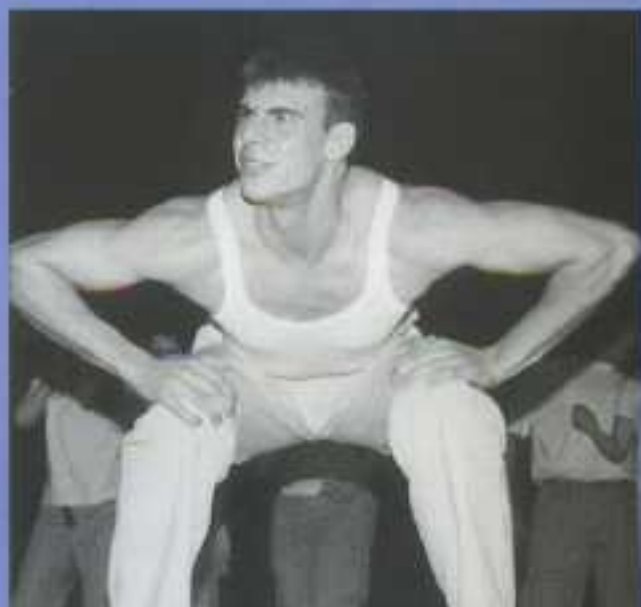

Ancient History: These four OAC girls are soon to leave OAC, but like Greece. Steph, Laura, Steph, and Carrie will not be forgotten.

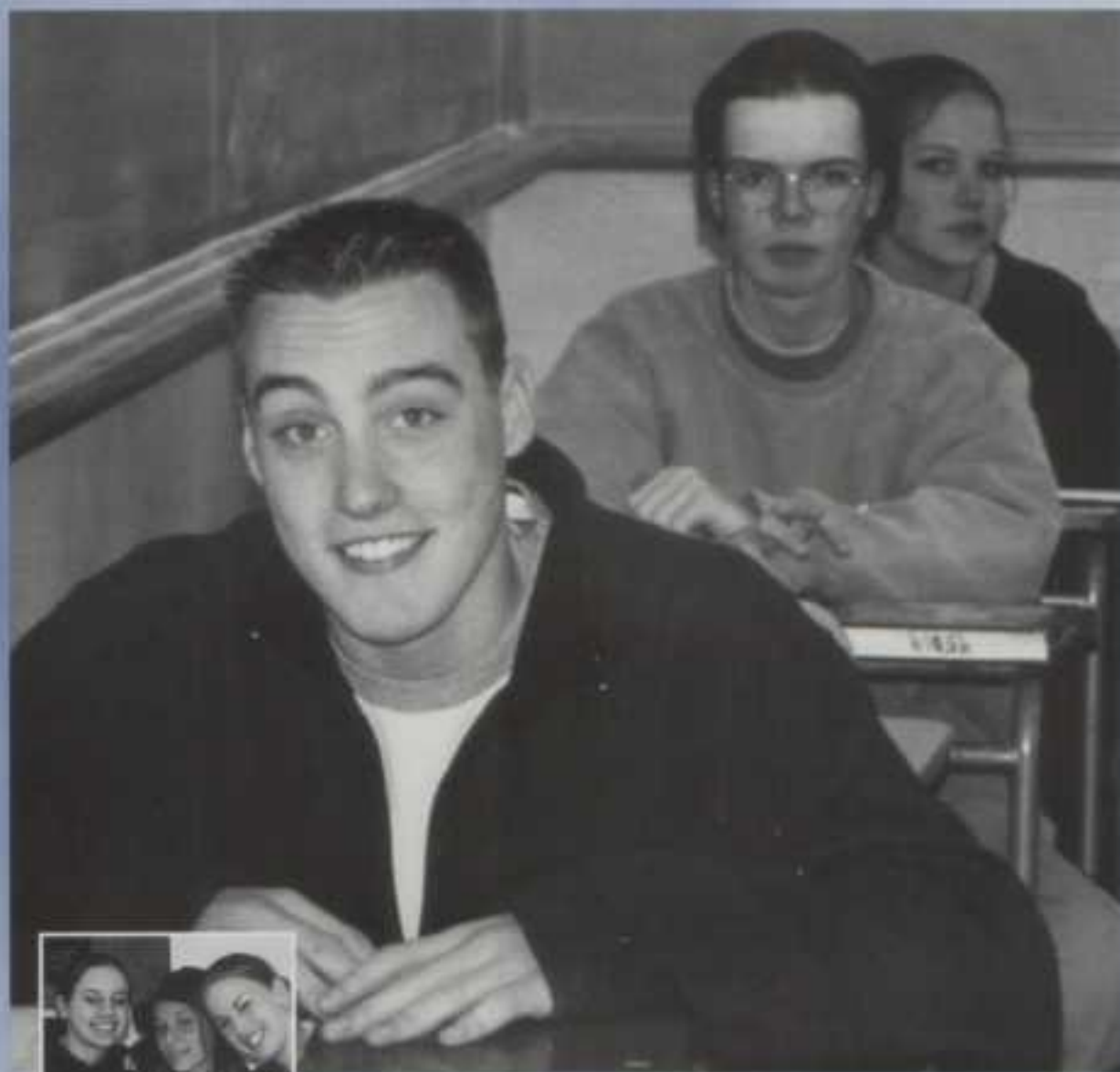

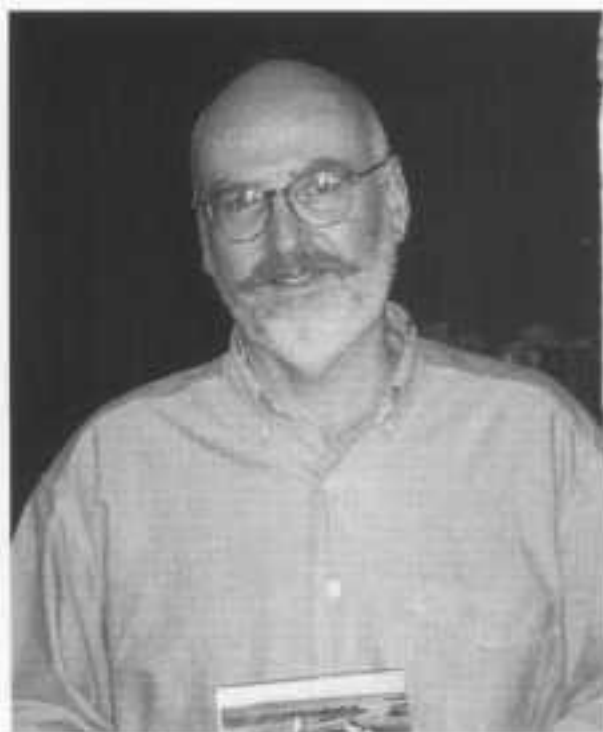
