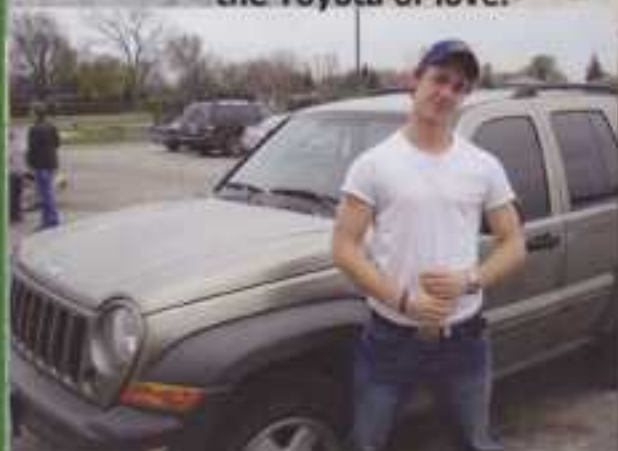

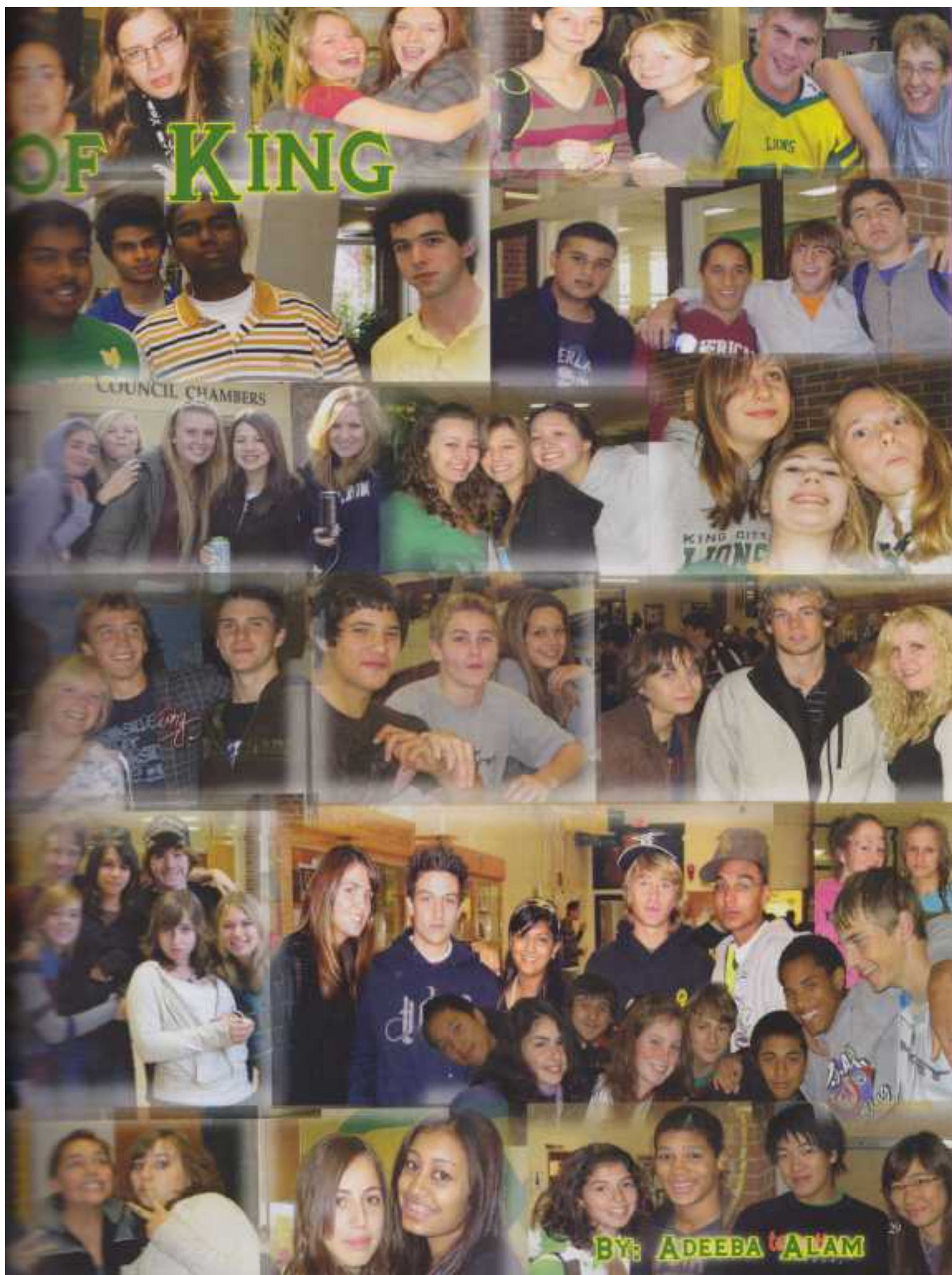

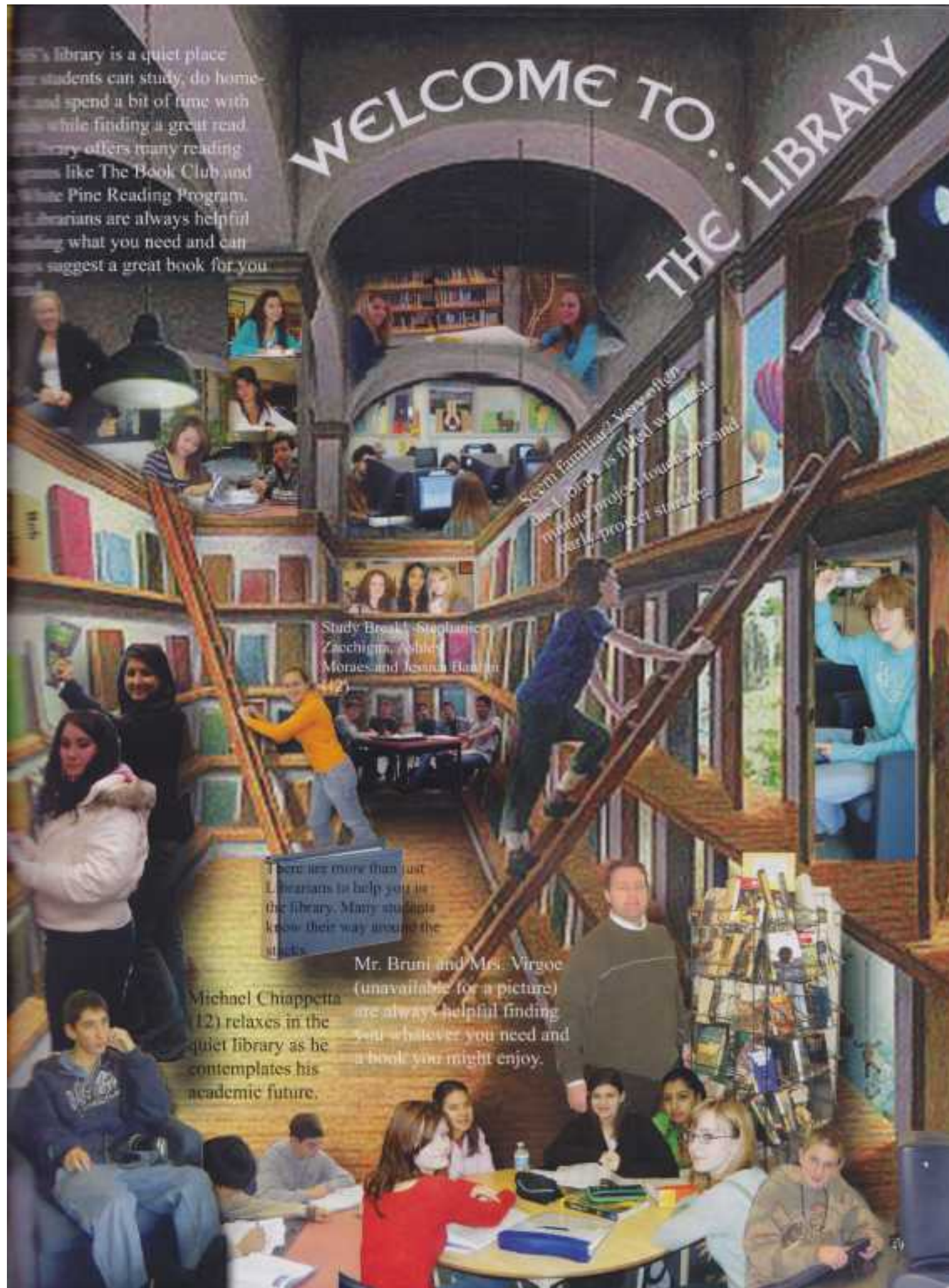

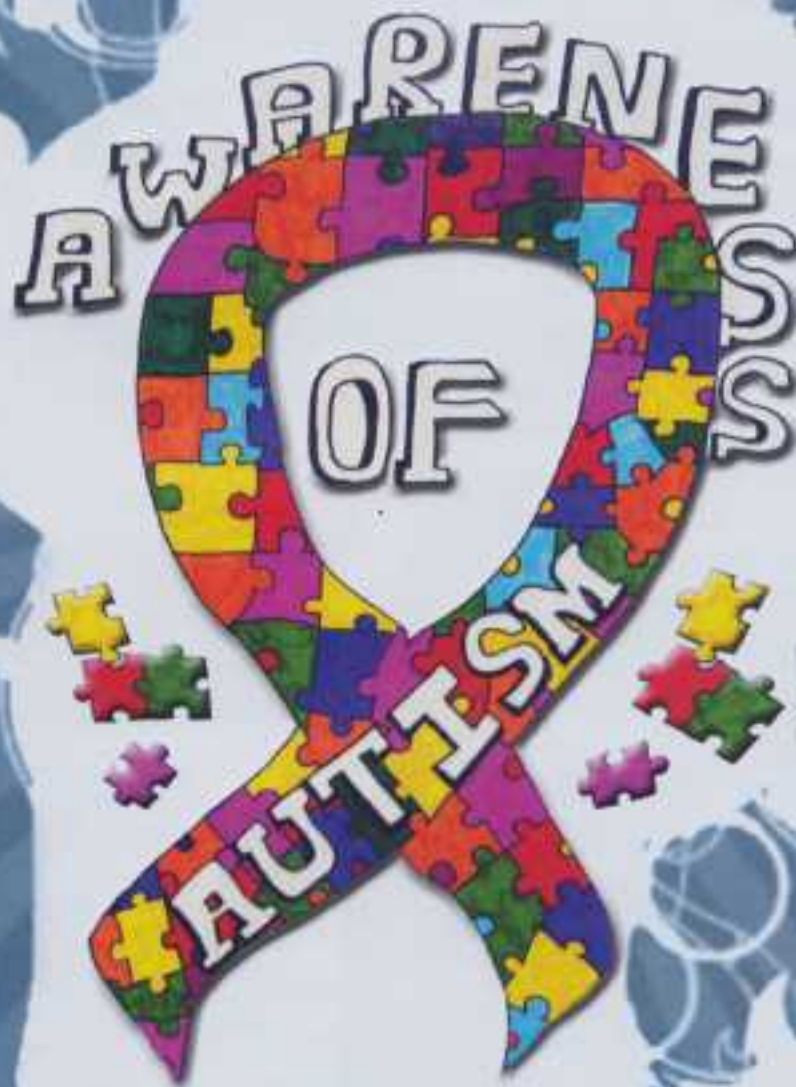
Autism.

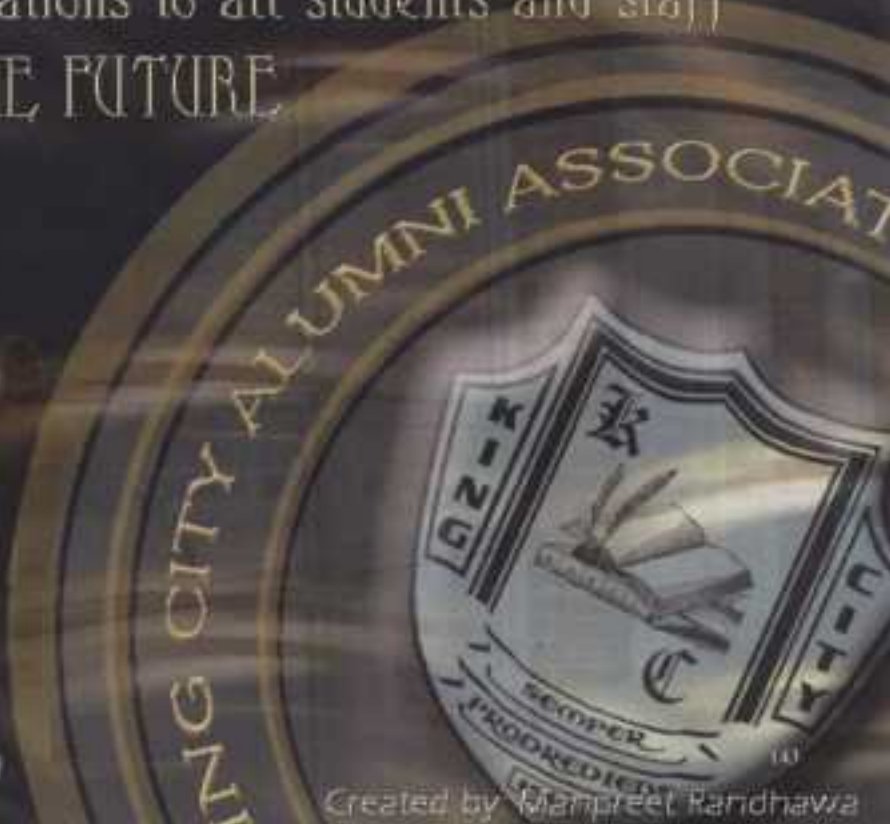

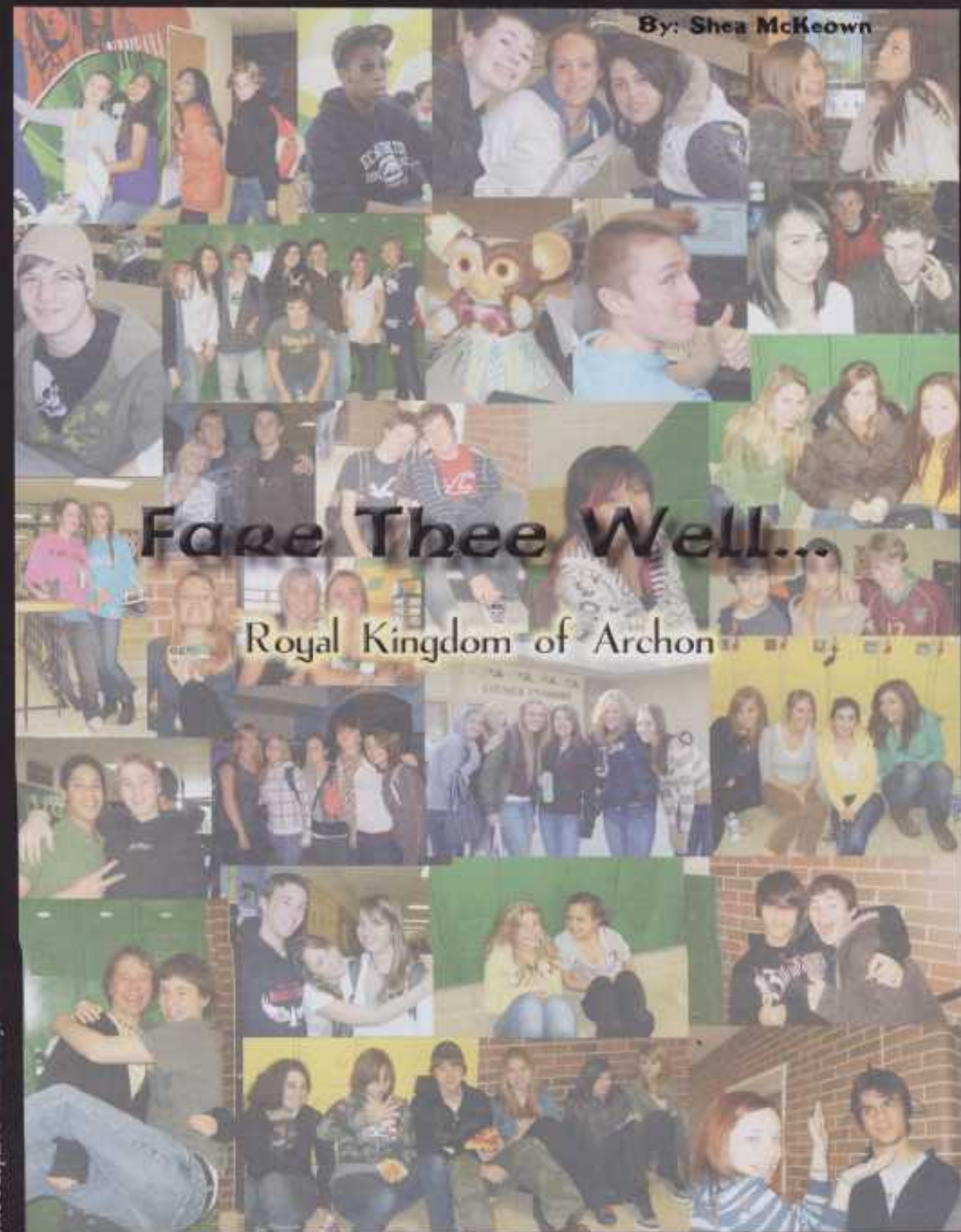
