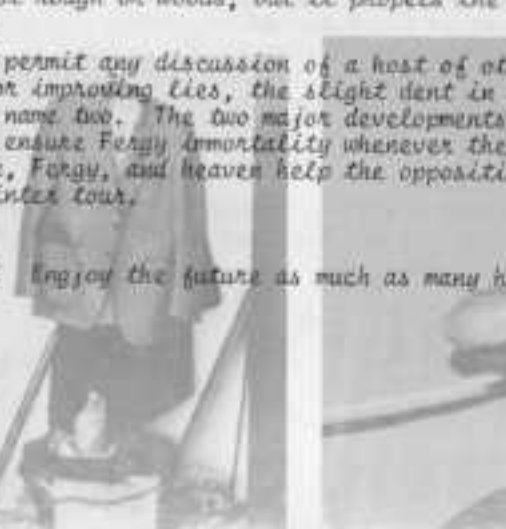
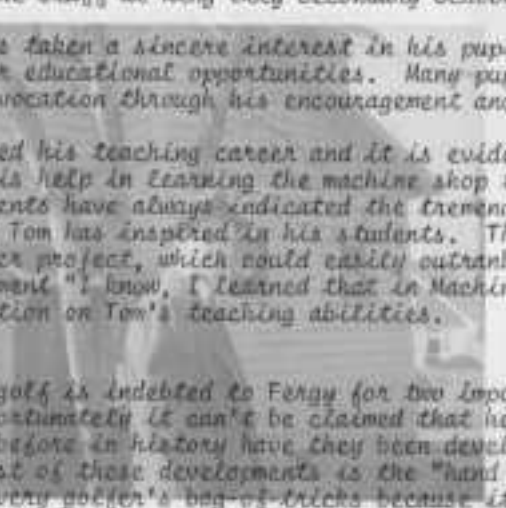
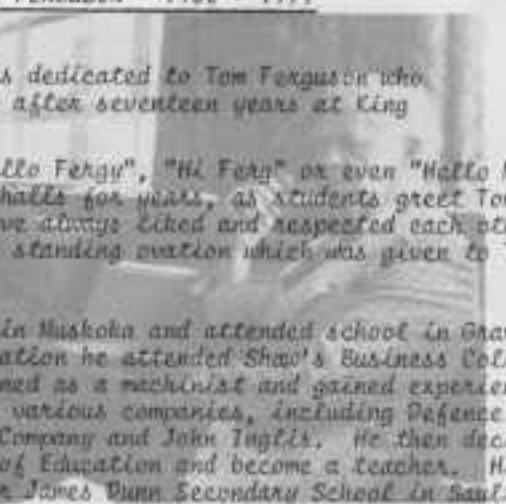
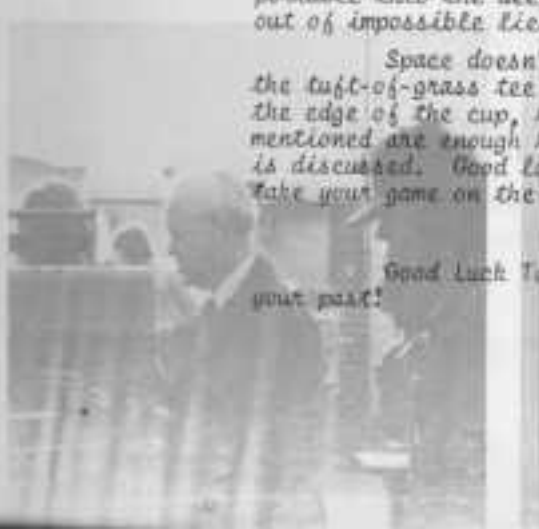
Tom has always taken a sincere interest in his pupils and tried to impress on them their educational opportunities. Many pupils have attained work in their vocation through his encouragement and counsel.

Valedictory Address

Good evening ladies and gentlemen,

I have recently come to realize what a difficult task it is to sum up the feelings of an entire class of people as they reflect on their high school days here at King City Secondary. After all, we don't live and experience our high school days as one large group of grade 13's or grade 12's- we move in smaller circles, having a few close friends and the rest being casual friends.

A common sentiment among last year's 13's, however, was that we felt ourselves to be the year that was "dumped on." We were deprived of initiation, a grade 13 locker hall, denied the right to put a deer on our study room or even sing Christmas carols in the halls. For us, then, these were important social elements that brought together the grade 13's as one unit- as a senior class we felt we were entitled to these things and our feelings have not changed.

But I speak tonight also on behalf of the graduating class of last year's grade 12's whose attitudes towards high school are difficult for me to know. Certainly we can not all agree on having loved high school or having hated high school, but undoubtedly every one of us can agree on having learned from it.

Apart from the essential and practical lessons of having learned how to duck flying oranges and sandwiches in the cafeteria, we have incorporated the more applicable and subtler lessons of high school in our day to day lives in university, college, the working world or wherever we may be now.

Though we may have forgotten the awkward stages of adolescence, we have not forgotten the truths we learned from them. Remember, now, the lonely feeling of eating lunch alone, not having a date for Friday's dance, breaking out in blemishes on picture day, and that aching, annoying feeling of not fitting in at parties. Has it all passed? Have we matured to the point where we no longer worry so much how we look and what people think? Most of us have learned by now that competing for marks or popularity are not solely aspects of high school, but that it is in high school that these things seem most important to us. By our senior year here, we have hopefully learned that each one of us is the most important judge of our work and our achievements. We may have had a painful time learning that "fitting in" does not come easily but that being able to feel at ease with a group, as well as with oneself, is an essential lesson of growing up.

Perhaps the worst thing about high school, then, was having to experience it as a teenager, because being a teenager is hard enough in itself.

But our memories of high school are certainly not all glum. The friendships made were lasting ones, even when particular friends parted for different ends of the province to seek their individual interests. And even if we hesitate to admit it, some of our classes here were actually fun!

Our teachers were good- some in fact were excellent, and for those of us who have moved on to a higher education and even for many who haven't, we can, probably for the first time, really appreciate the education these teachers gave us. In today's society teachers don't always have an easy time of it, but if they think for a moment that theirs is a thankless job, they need only speak to the graduates five months after school's end to understand how very appreciated they are.

To the new grade 13's, we older and more experienced students want to wish you luck on breaking in not only a new year, but also a new principal as well. There will be times when the work is hard and heavy, and you'll find yourself on the brink of insanity- ready to call it quits- but at those times take a moment and think on the graduates here tonight and you'll say to yourself, "If they could do it, anybody can!"

Their project, Spectral Sensitivity in Planaria, took top prizes at the fair: Gold medal-Senior Life Science, Spectroscopy Society of Canada Award, Biological Council of Canada Award, and the Shell Canada Award- a 2 week all expense paid trip to London, England. They exposed planaria, fresh water flatworms, to different intensities and wavelengths of light. The results were put together mathematically to represent the planaria's sensitivity to the visible spectrum.

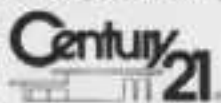
FUND RAISING COMMITTEE

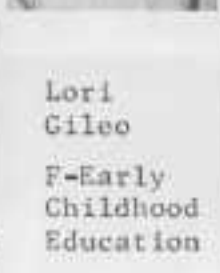

She says diving is a challenge, practice and confidence are the key factors to winning.



Glenn Patten became a competitive swimmer at the age of ten swimming with the Richmond Hill Aquatic Club moving on to the North York Aquatic Club. He is now swimming with the Etobicoke Swim Club coached by Derek Snelling.

In the 1978 O.F.S.A.A. Glenn placed 1st in the 200 metre Individual Medley and 3rd in the 100 metre Butterfly. Glenn made the 1978 and 1979 U.S.A. vs. CANADA College Tour competing against Universities in Miami and Alabama. He has competed in the last 3 Canadian Nationals and this year received a bronze medal as part of the 4X50 metre Freestyle Relay Team at the Pan American Game Trials held in Edmonton, Alberta. In individual events in Edmonton Glenn placed in the top 10-20 in the Butterfly and Freestyle. Glenn's future goal is to make the 1980 or 1984 Olympics!
