



Rules Of Play

OBJECT OF GAME

The object of King Game is to graduate from K.C.S.S. by scoring 100 points for your school letter and 100 marks. This will be accomplished by going through such yearly events as "Exam Time", "Initiation", and "Team Try-outs" and by play on the outer board.

EQUIPMENT

The equipment required to play this game is: playing pieces such as coins, buttons, or playing pieces from other board games, a set of dice, a note pad and pen for keeping score.

Your score pad should be arranged in this basic manner:

INNER BOARD (EVENTS) PLAY

There are six events found on the inner board. Each player must complete four different events of those available. Each player must complete "Exam Time" as one of their four events.

To be eligible to enter any one of the events you must land on its own entry square. For example, to enter the event Initiation you must move to the entrance square (marked Initiation) by an exact throw of the dice. When playing the inner board, you move by using only one die.

Upon completion of each event of the inner board, you record it on your score pad and enter 10 marks to your total after completing the following, "Office In", "Initiation", "Exam Time" and "Young Love". Record 10 points towards your school letter after completing "Team Try-outs", and "Archon Staff".

To score points and marks, events may be entered more than once but this only counts as one event. (eg. through Archon Staff twice still counts as only 1 event completed.)

N.B. When playing on the inner board, event called "Office In" you must proceed around the large loop unless you land on the third square by an exact roll of the die and then on your next turn roll more than 3 and proceed out as directed.

SCORING

Marks for your graduation and points for your school letter can be achieved as mentioned in Inner Board Play. Other marks or points can be earned as the player lands on squares where points or marks are awarded.

Points may be traded for marks by landing on the "Trade Opportunity" square. To trade you must trade 2 for 1 (eg. 20 points earns you 10 marks or vice versa). Trading can only occur after you have achieved the 100 marks or points necessary for each category and only when you land on a "Trade Opportunity" square as the result of an exact role of the die. Marks or points to be traded must be traded 2 for 1. The smallest unit that can be traded is 10. (eg. 10 points for 5 marks, 30 marks for 15 points etc.)

THE PLAY

To begin play, the players each roll the dice. The player with the highest number rolls first, second highest rolls second etc.

Players start at the school bus and play proceeds in a clockwise direction with each player advancing by a roll of the dice. As the players proceed around the outer board and inner board they must follow the instructions found on the game board.

BUMPING AND DETENTION SQUARES

When a player lands on any square (except detention or any corner square) already occupied by another player, he causes the other player to be bumped to the nearest Detention square. The player who is bumped must, on his regular turn, roll the dice and score over 6 before he is eligible to move on. If you fail to roll over 6 you must wait until your next regular turn and try again. This process is repeated until a roll of the dice scores over 6.

SPECIAL NOTES

1. This game is played in a manner similar to Parker Brothers Careers.
2. Players cannot trade points or marks with other players.
3. The game described previously is the short game. This game can be played in a longer version. In the longer game, a player would complete these requirements 4 or 5 times. (equivalent of years 9-12 or 9-13.)
