

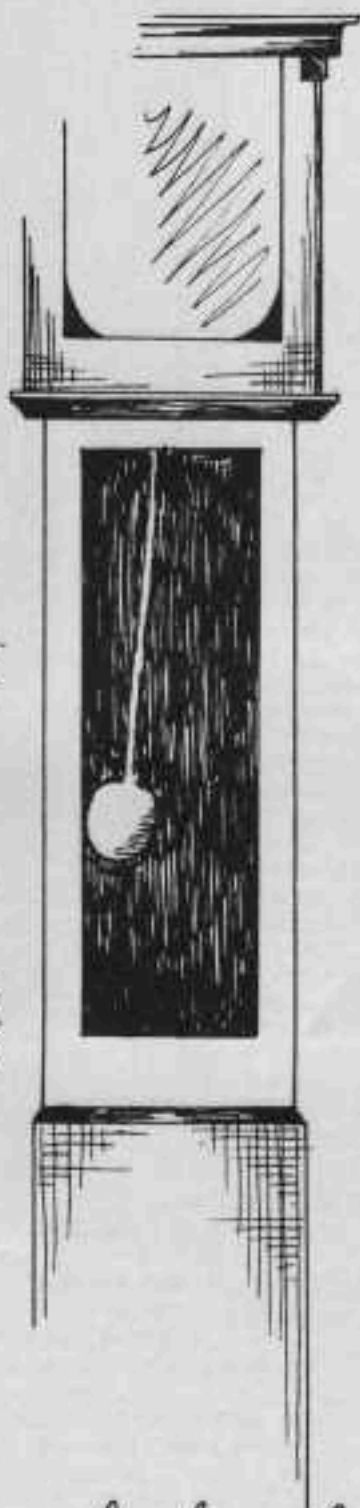
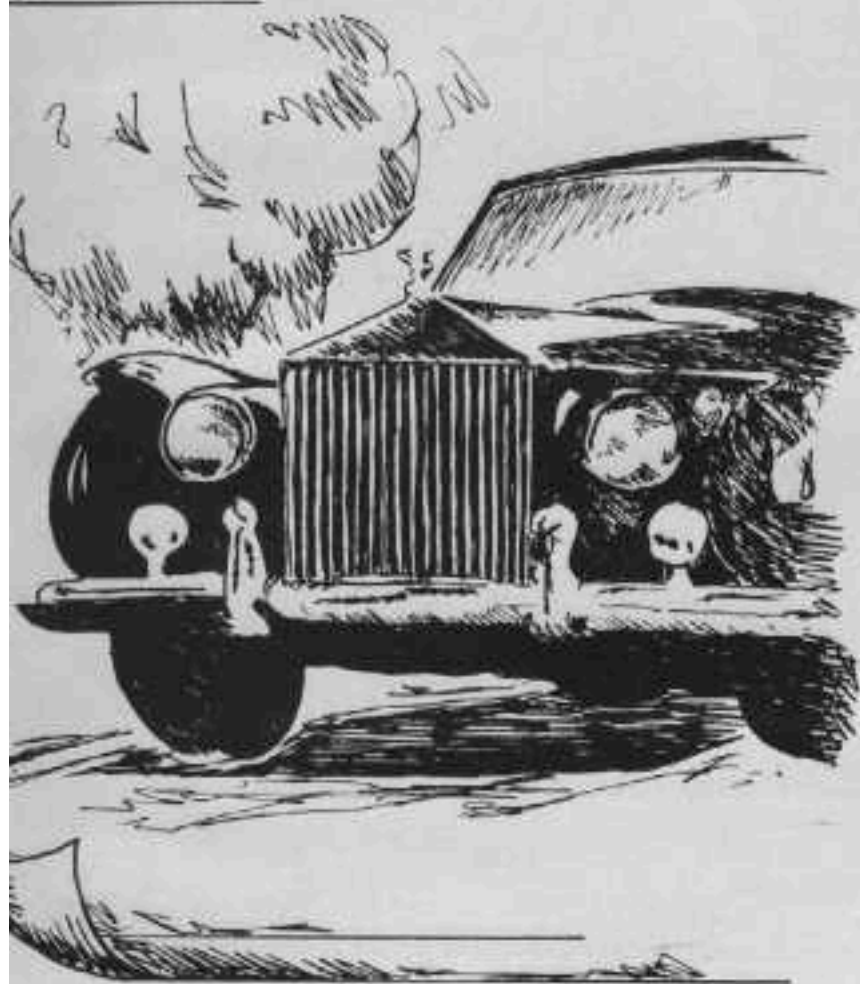

To tell a chair from a table?

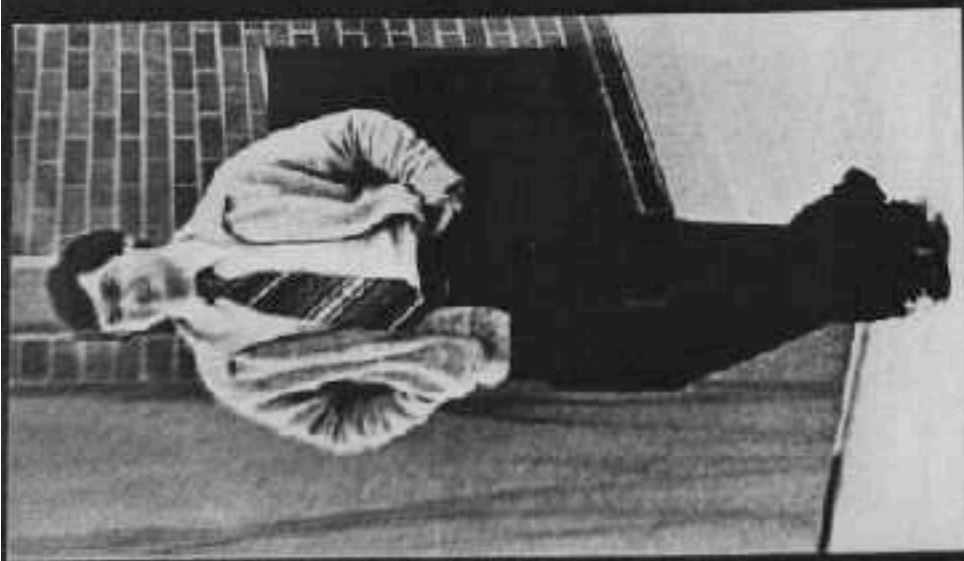

'Evita' broke the O'Keefe Centre's box office record of \$4,539,147.

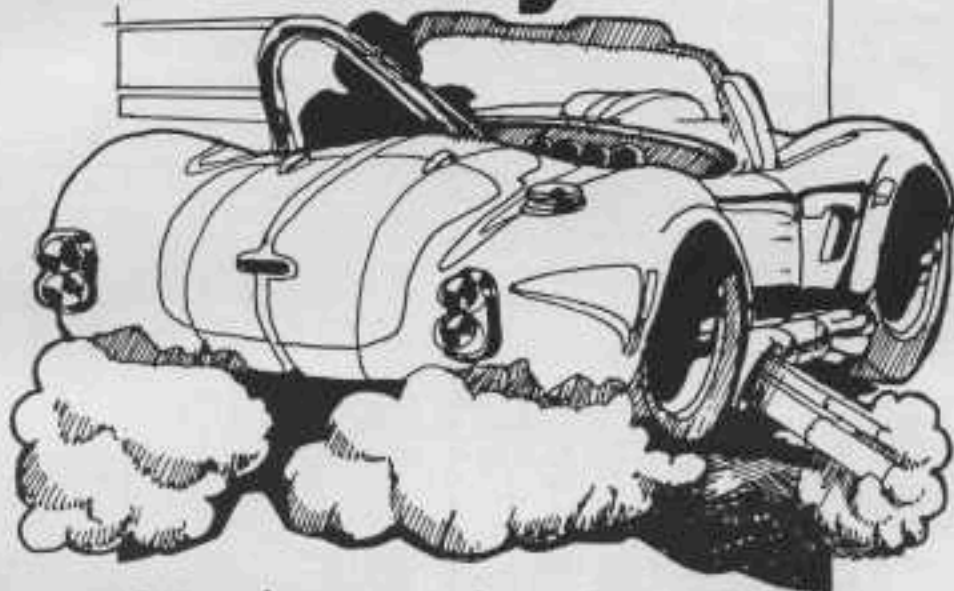
Sadly, a few took bows in the movie industry. Henry Fonda, Princess Grace (Kelly) and Ingrid Bergman.

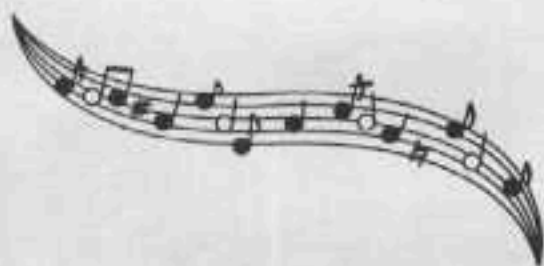
Prom
