
... the football teams held their annual Pep. Rally and slave auction.

#### VALEDICTORIAN ADDRESS

It's hard to take some of the most colourful years of your life and put them into black and white, yet it's important and necessary that we reflect on what has been achieved over the past four or five years.

Perhaps it is only once we graduate that we realize that high school is the most important of all formal education. Your high school years come at a most crucial point in your life - a time of social and personal change and development. The first time we entered the halls of K.C.S.S. we still had one hand holding on tightly to those spron strings, but with the other hand, we dered to explore. We dabbled in arts, sciences, technical skills. We learned about a lot. Eventually we let go of the apron strings altogether and used both hands to sift through the masses of ideas we were being exposed to.

I remember wishing I had six hands to be able to cope. We learned to think; critically; we learned to face not only the facts, but how to draw our own conclusions; to make intelligent, adult, rational decisions. As Emerson once said, "The things taught in schools and colleges are not an education, but the means of an aducation." So here we are now -- full of curiosity, questions, and some skepticism about what we see, but trained to keep an open mind so that we can analyse and make sense out of what we are about to experience in life -- our real education. This piece of paper, our diploma, doesn't give us the right to say, "I am a learned person", it says, "I am ready to be a learned person", a task that takes a lifetime.

But all this can be said of any graduate in any graduating class. And we are not just any graduates; we are the Class of '83. Like other grade 13's before us, we had the opportunity to "welcome the grade 9's to high school life. But it was only the Class of '83 that planned the initiation for September, but never pulled it off until November. However, I also recall that when the grade 13 curriculum didn't allow for a physical education program, it was the same graduates who put one together themselves during spare time.

We also acknowledge the contributions of Individuals who characterized our class and made it stand out from the others before us. We have Tom Kidd and Carol Tomlinson to thank for the paper shortage at King, having accumulated over 150 admit slips between the two of them. We thank Rick Pennycooke and Al Mackensie for entertaining us with their cafeteria sing-a-longs, during period 5 lunch. We congratulate Denise Matthews and Matt McCarthy, who, spart from the regular work load, played the leading roles in our production of "Li'l Abner", We recognize the outstanding achievements of Greg Betty and Chris Doble, having carned an all expense paid university education and job security from General Motors. I cannot forget to mention Richard Konop, our over-worked President and his supporting staff who worked hard to make the activities of this school function so successfully. I'd also like to thank Andrew Wood -- I don't know why, but without him our class just wouldn't be the same. But most of all I congratulate all of the graduates here tonight, not only for successfully completing 4 or 5 years of hard work, but for putting on the best Christmas Assembly in King City's history. or at least we would have if Christmas hadn't come so early last year,

We remember English and Physics that we replaced with skating parties, and baseball games; we remember the fun we had dressing up for the From, only to be thrown into Richard's pool at the breakfast party. And the fun we had didn't end with high school, but continued on during the summer, with Matt's book-burning party. Remember the satisfaction we felt seeing those English B and Canadian History notes going up in flames? But the real satisfaction came not from seeing a year's worth of work burn away, but from the sense of achievement that those notes symbolized. There were so many good times we shared together, it is impossible to one speech to encompass all of them.






other many times. Of course, who could forget singing Crease songs in French, or Mr. Young's 5 minute version of the play, or our trip to Gaithersburg?





In October, the grade nine advanced geography students went on a trip to the Miagra Encarpment and the Credit River. They identified rock samples


























as part of the 13-A english course.


The bands participated in band exchanges once again. The senior band had an exchange to Ottawa, while the junior band had an exchange to North Boy.


## midget














# WHAT IS A FRIEND ?
