


















Boom! Dynamite!

A whole year of kissing up. Has just gone to waste. A complete new set of teachers, Is what most had to face.




Grade elevens are at that in-between stage, they can't run around acting like niners, but they aren't quite ready to become absorbed in our work like our OAC comrades.























Gladiator games
