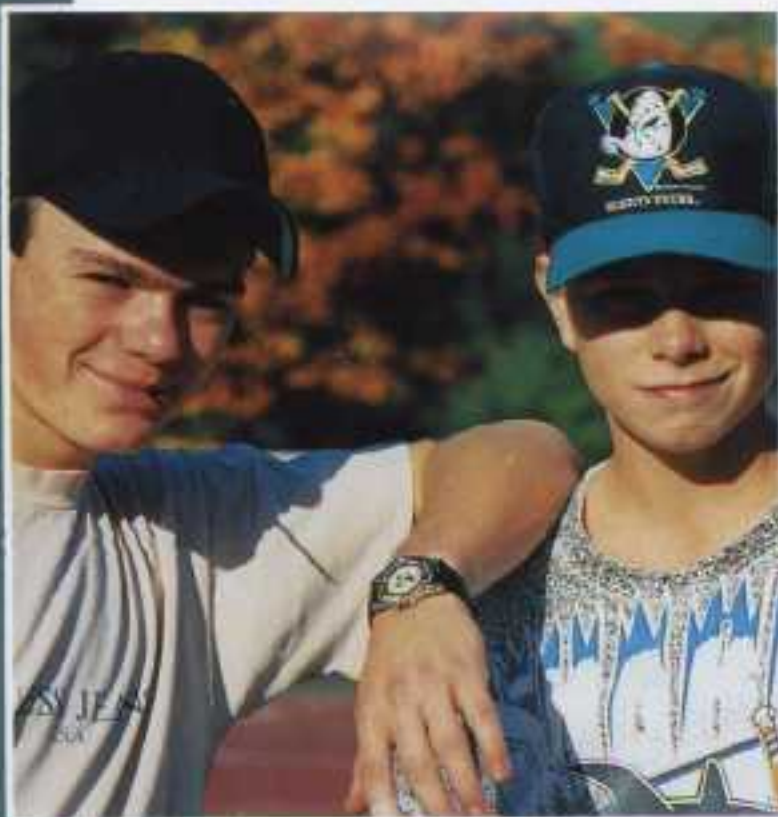

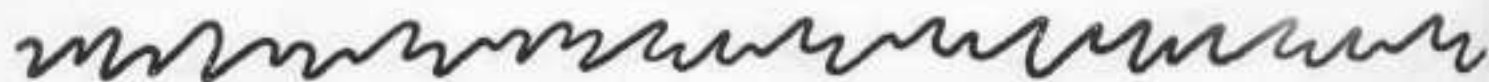
Procrastinator's Club

Choir

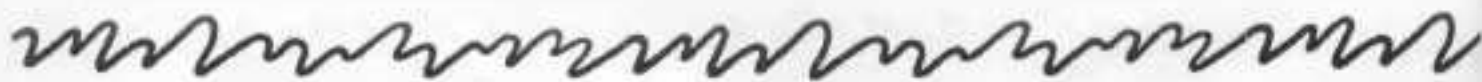
